MS1 Understand Yourself

- Access the AAMC <u>Careers in Medicine (CiM) website</u> and take the MSPI assessment to help you think about potential specialties
- Meet with your Coach to discuss your interests and your CiM assessments
- ❖ Visit a <u>Student Run Clinic</u>
- Consider attending different SIG events, Career Speed Dating, lunch time talks and Activities Fair events to learn about extracurricular activities and specialty areas
- Learn about <u>research</u> opportunities
- Improve your learning skills by attending an <u>OSLER</u> session
- Get involved in extracurricular activities (<u>SRC</u>, <u>Research</u>, <u>SIG</u> etc.). Set goals with your <u>Coach</u> for career exploration
- Keep a record of all the extracurricular activities in which you are involved for your CV
- Plan and select your Summer Project
- Start Shadowing
- If you are interested in a competitive specialty (e.g., dermatology, orthopedics, plastic surgery, urology, ENT etc.), meet with the specialty advisor
- Attend Monthly Career Advising Series
- Learn about and attend <u>Poster</u>

- Attend Career Speed Dating session: understand yourself and explore your options

MS2 Explore Your Options

- Present your research at Poster Day

MS3 Choose your Specialty

- Meet with your Coach to review your clinical skills performance & career decision making
- Consider meeting with the OSLER team to prepare for your shelf exams
- Consider revisiting the MSPI and PVIPS assessment to clarify whether your career preferences are stable or evolving
- Meet with mentors about your career interests
- Identify away rotations for your 4th year
- ❖ If you are considering a gap year, meet with your <u>Coach</u>
- To address any areas of indecision, take the <u>Specialty Indecision Scale (SIS)</u> assessment on the AAMC website
- Start working on your CV using the CV template and send it to Woubejig for feedback
- ❖ If you are considering couples matching, set up an appointment with Dr. Jain to learn more about the process
- ❖ Sign up for <u>USMLE Step 2 CK</u>
- Explore specialty web resources including FREIDA database, TexasSTAR, and Residency Explore
- Attend Career Speed Dating session: how to choose a specialty and Road to Residency
- Attend Monthly Career Advising Series
- Arrange individual meetings with Dr Jain to plan your residency application process

MS4 Prepare for Residency

- ❖ Meet with your <u>Coach</u> and <u>specialty advisor</u>
- Complete your away rotation before September
- ❖ Request letters of recommendation for your ERAS® application (April)
- ❖ Complete your 3 noteworthy characteristics due 6/30
- Start working on your CV and personal statement due in September
- Meet with your <u>Specialty advisor</u> to choose programs to which you wish to apply
- Complete your <u>ERAS®</u> residency application by 9/15
- ❖ Schedule Mock interview
- ❖ Get your Interview outfit ready
- ❖ Review your CV and Personal Statement before your interview
- Prepare for interview by reviewing common interview questions
- ❖ Attend Last Minute Interview Advice workshop
- Do your research about different programs
- ❖ Alumni Connect: Visit the UC Davis Alumni Association to connect with Alumni
- Take pros/cons notes after each interview
- Get your <u>NRMP ID</u> and work with your advisor to rank your order list
- ❖ Attend Match Day events
- ❖ Attend Transition to Residency (T2R)
- Consider mentoring 3rd year students
