As a health care practitioner, you play an integral part in facilitating the applications process for your patients. This course provides an in-depth review of the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). Participants will learn how to interpret and complete the certification forms, their rights and obligations as the treating medical practitioner and how to protect themselves from liability. Creating a lab environment that is inclusive of all members requires thought and effort. This training provides guidance on how to create an anti-racist lab through awareness, discussion, transparency, advocacy, and new practices. Participants will learn new leadership skills necessary to create deep equity in their lab. These leadership skills can help a PI's lab members to have increased feelings of belonging, a deeper commitment to STEM, and a greater sense of self efficacy. Creating a lab culture where all members feel fully accepted can also bring new insights and improve research innovations and outcomes.
